PROGRESS OF PROJECT ACTIVITIES DURING -2024-25

4. Climate Proofing project/ Programme(CPP)-NABARD:

Backdrop: With a view to address climate impacts, NBARD has launched programmes in completed watersheds which complement and supplement the efforts village communities. The proposed Climate Proofing project / programme is one of them which will add value to the current initiative and improve resilience to climate variability and with focus on mitigation and adaptation practices to climate related negative situation impacting the livelihoods of vulnerable communities in watershed areas. It will focus on vulnerable communities like small and marginal farmers who are going to be impacted largely by the changes in climate.



The programme is going to enhance the adaptive capacity of the community in general and farmers in particular. The project looks at resilience of the watersheds much beyond the



usual soil and water conservation focused drought proofing measures and is beyond the business-as-usual practice and can be considered as concrete adaptation. SHARP has successfully completed Anantharam (YadadriBhongirdistrict) and Dhanvada (Jayashankar Bhupalapally district) CPP projects. Presently, CPP-Devarampally

(Jayashankar Bhualapally district) is in progress and activities of which are listed here in under:

Major achievements during 2024-25 in CPP-Devarampally Project:

Under the component of Sustainable & Agricultural Practices to enhance Livelihoods; The following activities were carried out during the reporting period:

- ✓ Grounded 2 Pandal based vegetable farming units.
- ✓ 7 units of Integrated farming system (IFS)
- ✓ Grounded 30 units of Zeero based Natural farming (ZBNF) practices.
- ✓ Under documentation process, a short video film and browser was developed by the consultant team.



5. Integrated Farming System (IFS) in support of Technology: (CSR-CD-NTPC-& NABARD):

NABARD has sanctioned the project on “Integrated Farming System in support of Technology: Solution to water conservation manure management, food security, Regular farmers income and corp. productivity. NTPC and NABARD has released the grant for the said project as matching grant i.e., 50:50 basis. “This project is being implemented in Palakurthy mandal of Peddapalli district, Telangana state covering the 06 villages viz.Kannala (Cluster village),Ranapur, Bamla Nayak thanda, Brahmanapally, Anthargam and GD Nagar

Progress of activities during the period of 2024-25:

Eco Farm Ponds (EFPs) including fishery: During the financial period, there were 10 Eco Farm Ponds (EFPs) including fishery are executed and completed. So, till now, all the sanctioned 20 EFPs are completed by including these 10 EFPs. In most of the EFPs, farmers are rearing Pangas, Rohu and Korrameenu other typical fishes. The fruit plants like Papaya and banana; vegetable plants like, drumsticks; creepers like Ash gourd were grown around the bund of farm pond in multi tire system as multi nutritious food supplement. Fingerlings of Local type of fishes like Pangas, bocha etc., are released into all these farm ponds.



Pandal based Vegetable cultivation: There are 10 no of Pandal Based Vegetable Cultivation (PBVC) fields are grounded and completed during the captioned period. So, till now, all the sanctioned 20 PBVC plots are completed by including these 10 PBVCs. On an average, each IFS farmer of 1 acre holding has produced 40 Qtls of vegetables per year (2 seasons) from his Pandal based vegetable cultivation. Beneficiaries are using these vegetables for their own consumption as well as vending through the outside market.



Buffalo rearing: During the period,

Ten farmers were supported with Buffaloes as a access to Milk for their family. By adding these, all the sanctioned 20 Buffaloes are supported to 20 beneficiaries. Local/ Deshi Murra breed Buffalo is given to farmers. Farmers provided small cattle shed by their own at their backyards for looking after the animals.



Goats rearing: during the period, 10 units of Small ruminants units are distributed to the beneficiaries. By adding these, the cumulative units that completed under the IFS

project would be 20 units. Each unit comprising of 5 animals (4+1) each; which includes one male animal is given to the beneficiary farmer. At present, On an average, each IFS farmer having 5 goats has produced 80 kg of meat per year (2 seasons).



▪ **Poultry: Till the reporting period,** Poultry birds of 14 units; each 21(20+1) birds to each farmer is supplied to each beneficiary farmer. At present, On an average, each IFS farmer having 20 birds have produced a minimum of 100 kgs chicken per year (2 seasons).

- **Fodder Cultivation: 10** units of Fodder plots each 10 gunta is are being raised by 10 farmers. Farmers are cutting the fodder and feeding to their milch animals.
- **Flori Culture: 10** units of Flori culture plots each 10 gunta is are being raised by 10 farmers. Few farmers from Anthargam village have got Rs. 2000 to 10000 incomes in peak season of Bathukamma festival and during last Sammakka Sarakka Jathara.
- **Compost Pit: 10** units of compost pits: one for each farmer is grounded. Crop dry stock and animal dung is being filled in these pits.

6. Integrated Tribal Development Programme (ITDP) under NABARD-TDF:

NABARD has sanctioned grant assistance for **Integrated Tribal Development Programme** under Tribal development Fund (TDF) to cover 500 tribal families out of which 400 beneficiaries will be covered under WADI development (one acre horticulture plantation to each beneficiary i.e., total 400 acres or 400 WADIs) and 100 landless beneficiaries will be provided with livelihood activities under NABARD's grant assistance For 400 beneficiaries. The project shall be implemented for a period of 06 years. The major aim of the project is to create sustainable livelihood opportunities and provide beneficiaries with appropriate additional income to at least double their present income levels within a specified period of time.

Proposed villages under ITDP project: There are 09 villages of Mahamutharam mandal of Jayshankar Bhupalapally district proposed for the ITDP project are viz. Pegadapalli, Premnagar, Borlagudem, Regulagudem, Kanukanuru, Reddipalle, Singaram, Singampally, Stambampally (PK) and Modhedu.

Activities carried out during the period of 2024-25:

- **Horticulture plantation & maintenance works:** The activities carried out under this component are:
 - ✓ 250 acres of Mango plantation with staking to each plant. Around each WADI of 1 acre, Teak as boarder plants is planted. And hence, till now, a cumulative of 400 acres of WADI plantation is completed under the ITDP Project.
 - ✓ Neem oil and vermin compost were applied to all the plants in 250 acres of extent.
 - ✓ Solar fencing was done for 100 acres/ 100 WADIs to safeguard the horticulture crop form wild bores and other animals.
 - ✓ For irrigation/ watering in regular intervals, to plants, a 2nd hand Tractor & Tanker is purchased by the PTDC committee. Substantial amount is found to be saved by this tractor irrigation.



• Livelihood activities: A total 50 interventions are grounded:

- ✓ During the year, Goat Rearing Units of 13 units are distributed to 13 families. Each unit of goats comprised of 7 animals (6+1). So, till now, a total of 39 goat rearing units are grounded. During last year the family income was found to be raised by 35% from goat rearing activity.
- ✓ One back yard poultry unit also grounded during the year. So, till now, a total of 5 Poultry rearing units are grounded.
- ✓ Flour mill-1, Kirana Store-2, Chicken Center-2, and Emporium-1 During the last year, the family's income increased by approximately 30% to 40% from these activities.



• Water Resource Development activities:

- ✓ 5 bore wells (including 5 pump sets) with respective accessories were completed during the year.
- ✓ 2 Farm ponds are dug for improving the ground water availability.
- ✓ 150 no of Water tubs/ Barrels are also supplied and set for water storage and timely irrigation to the horticulture plants.
- ✓ 84 PVC Pipes were distributed for 21 acres of WADIs. 4 pipes are installed for each wadi.



7. Farmers Producers Organizations (FPOs):

Backdrop: National vision about the FPOs is to build a prosperous and sustainable agriculture sector by promoting and supporting member-owned Producer Organizations, that enable farmers to enhance productivity through efficient, cost-effective and sustainable resource use and realize higher returns for their produce, through collective action supported by the government, and fruitful collaboration with academia, research agencies, civil society and the private sector.



Progress of FPOs during the period 2024-25

- **Prasanna Farmers Producer Company Ltd.** covering of 3 watershed villages viz., Anantharam, Seetharampuram & Brahmanapalli of Gundala mandal and Theryala of Motakondur mandal fall in Yadadri Bhongir (erstwhile Nalgonda). During the period, FPO carried out the business activities related to Seed, Fertilizers and Pesticides. As the NGO capacity building period is over, presently the BOD members are running the FPCL business activities on their own.
- **Susthira Farmers Producer Company Ltd** Covering 3 watershed villages viz., Devarampalli, Dhanvada and Bayyaram of Kataram mandal in Jayashankar Bhupalapalli district (erstwhile Karimnagar). Presently the BOD members itself are running the FPCL business activities by their own; as the NGO capacity building period is completed.



- **Sreesedya Farmer Producer Company Ltd.:** Sanctioned recently and covering the villages viz. Athmakur, Moripirala, Chinnagudem, Mudugukunta, Alka Bhavi, Singaram, Kalvapally and Koratikal villages of Yadadri Bhongir district. Till the reporting period, the no of share holders has come to 450 farmers.

➤ **Bheemalingeshwara Farmer Producer Company Ltd.:** Sanctioned recently and covering the villages viz. Chada, Muthireddygudem,Chendepally, Chamapur, Kondapuram, Katepally, Nacharipeta, and Khadirenigudem of Yadadri Bhongir district. Till the reporting period, the no of share holders has come to 370 farmers.

➤ **Medaram Girijana Farmer Producer Company Ltd:** Sanctioned recently and covering the villages viz. Borlagudem, Pegadapally, Premnagar, Stambampally, Singaram, Kankunur, Singampally, Reddypally ,Regulagudem and Modhedu of Jayshankar Bhupalapally district whose registration is under process. Till the reporting period, the no of share holders has come to 85 farmers.



8. Providing sustainable livelihood to Mahadevpur Tussar Silk Weavers"

for taking over some balance works under the project "Providing sustainable livelihood to Mahadevpur Tussar Silk Weavers" in Mahadevpur Village, Jayshankar Bhupalapally district, SHARP NGO has received financial support from NABARD under Gramya Vikas Nidhi (GVN) for implementing the project activities.

- Under Plant and Machinery establishment, Natural dye apparatus, Maggam Repair works and the Dabi and buta rods are installed.
- The trainings to weavers society viz. on Book Keeping and Management, Book Keeping and Management, E-advertisement, logo design Myntra, Amazon & Flipkart premium Advertisement offline- workshops are delivered by the NGO team.

9.Strengthening livelihoods of Pochampally Ikkat Handloom Weavers of Siripuram Cluster".

SHARP has got Grant Assistance) - for the project "Traceability for Sustainability and Marketability: Strengthening livelihoods of Pochampally Ikkat Handloom Weavers of Siripuram Cluster" under Gramya Vikas Nidhi (GVN) Location of the project activities is at Siripuram village, Ramannapeta Mandal, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district of Telangana state. No of Beneficiary Families covered in the society are 20.

10.Watershed Livelihood Program (WDF& IGWDP):

Though the Soil and water conservation activities are completed under WDF and IGWDP projects; livelihood related funds kept under respective 6 watershed project Livelihood accounts. Both, LH and MF together a total of about **3.20 crores** (including outstanding) in all together 6 watershed projects are there.NGO is regularly closely monitoring these funds through Livelihood para professionals. Recoveries of already distributed loans are under continuation rather fresh loans. All related books and accounts are being maintained by the NGO.


11. Integrated Community Development for Smart Village Transformation (ICD-SVT)-Project-Concern India Foundation

With a focus on Integrated Community Development and infrastructure development, in few villages of Telangana, SHARP has collaborated with CONCERN INDIA FOUNDATION. Based on the need assessment plans, Sharp NGO has facilitated some welfare and development activities through the project called “Integrated Community Development for Smart Village Transformation (ICD-SVT)”. SHARP has facilitated the Project activities across the 9 villages belong to 5 different districts.

Sharp has successfully facilitated the above said activities by coordinating with donor, vendors, village CBOs and beneficiaries.



❖ **General Programmes:**

1. Health Camps:

The SHARP NGO organized health camps in rural areas where the people not accessible to the health sources. Especially The women has undergone diagnosis and suggested respective treatment in these health camps by the doctors the specialists from each department. The NGO has also taken the risk to mobilize the people from villages to attend the health camp. Local leaders from Panchayat Raj (PRI) Institutions are also participated in this health camp. During the reporting period, the camps are organized in Mahamutharammandal of Jashankar Bhupalapally and Ramannapeta mandal of Yadadri Bhongir districts.

2. Blood Donation Camp:

To save the life's of injured or needy people for blood these camps were planned and organized by the NGO under the part of social service. NGO team coordinates with Doctors and mobilizes the people particularly of village youth. Under the guidance of doctors the blood is collected from donors and used to be preserved for needy people with free of cost. During the reporting period, camps are organized in Gundala mandal of Yadadri Bhongir district.

3. Child labor awareness programme:

SHARP NGO team use to organize child labor awareness programmes at their geographical area of working villages. Programmes are focusing the places where the children are engaged as labor force in work places viz., Bricks Units, agriculture and ancillary industries etc., Also use to aware The rural people on child marriage restraint act. During the reporting period, such awareness programmes are organized in Mahamutharam mandal of Jashankar Bhupalapally and Ramannapeta mandal of Yadadri Bhongir districts.

4. Cultural & Other Programmes:

The SHARP NGO organizes the cultural programmes on various village level issues viz., social, health, education, child labor, women and other related themes. Village level volunteers are motivated to participate and to make others to participate in the programme. The camp organized with kalajathas including cultural songs and folk dances. NGO team coordinates with the line departments and mobilize the people with support of

village volunteers to make the programmes successfully. During the period, camps are organized in Gundala mandal of Yadadri Bhongir district.

5. Women empowerment programmes:

In facilitating most of the Programmes or projects of SHARP, women were made to stand first. In most of the village level project implementing committees, majority of members are women. In all of the projects being facilitated by SHARP programmes, there are majority of the field level implementation committee members are of Women. One of the Women headed Watershed committee has also got best project implementation committee award by NABARD.
